### **Report 2010-11 and Aims 2011-12**

The members of this working group have particularly active by organizing national or regional meetings.

Many activities worth to be mentioned:

- UMAC-Mexico has held its fifth annual conference in Palacio de Minería in Mexico City on October 10, 2010. Very recently the group has developed a blog [www.museosuniversitariosmexico.blogspot.com](http://www.museosuniversitariosmexico.blogspot.com) where can be found a interesting presentation of the museums and the botanical gardens of the Mexican universities.
- A young group from Ukraine will organize the first meeting of UMAC-Ukraine on «University museums: European experience and Ukrainian practice» in Taras Shevchenko National University of Kiev (6-7/10/2011).
- Marine Mkrtchyan has organized in Yerevan a round table discussion for the Armenian University museum staff with the 20 participants from 9 different Armenian university museums and Lyndel King from the board of UMAC (15/04/2011)
- Several universities in Southeast Asia had come together to form University Museums Network Southeast Asia. Two meetings have been held in 2010, the last organised in December 2010 in Penang Malaysia. A network has been developed so as to share thoughts into museum practices in the context of universities in Southeast Asia. The next meeting and conference is expected to be in Bandung, Indonesia.
- The university of Santa Fe (Argentina) with the support of ICOM-Argentina has organized the first meeting of university museums of the Mercosur in Santa Fe (4-6/10/2010). 29 institutions (Argentina (21), Venezuela (1), Brazil (3), Uruguay (3), Chili (1)) have signed a declaration (). A second meeting will be held in the same location on 23/11/2011.
- Late June has been formed a Finnish Council of University Museums and Collections in a meeting at the Aalto University. The founders were 3 university museums Aalto (former HUT); University of Helsinki, and university of Jyväskylä.

- Elena Corradini (Modena) and Luigi Campanella (Roma) have organized a meeting in Rome on Feb. 4th with a representation of quite all Italian universities, which led to the creation of a University museum commission. A second meeting took place in Modena on June 11th. This group is very active in the process of evolution of Italian universities, in particular with significant documents sent to the Rectors of the Italian Universities which are very important at this very moment because the Italian University system is undergoing a complete reformation. The next meeting will be held in Rome on Oct. 28th. Moreover they have created a thematic commission about universities into ICOM-Italy ([http://www.icom-italia.org/index.php?option=com\\_content&task=view&id=782&Itemid=1](http://www.icom-italia.org/index.php?option=com_content&task=view&id=782&Itemid=1)) and a webportal of the Italian university museums ([www.pomui.unimore.it](http://www.pomui.unimore.it)) is under construction.

- Regional Report from Australia for UMAC Annual Report by A. Simpson

At recent CAUMAC (Council of Australian University Museums and Collections – a National Network of Museums Australia Inc) gatherings there has been a general sense that the nature of the higher education sector in Australia has undergone profound, and insufficiently reviewed, changes in the last decade. It was felt that the group needed both to reconnect with and re-identify the current status and interests of its constituency. A consultant was hired to undertake a new review of museums and collections in higher education with the purpose of:

- Identifying potential new members
- Identifying current trends in universities regarding collections
- Investigating models of governance

This work is still underway – to date more than 400 collections have been identified and more continue to be discovered. The current research has identified new categories of collections not reported in earlier research such as collections of digital objects; and collections and archives held by residential colleges, theological colleges and student organisations.

- Moreover a presentation of UMAC has been done during various meetings, including the annual meeting of the European network Universeum in Padova (26-29/5/2011).

For the next year, these activities will continue and more contacts will be developed with other institutions like national or regional networks.

### **3. Publications Working Group by N. Nyst** **Function/Aim**

This group was established in 2003. It co-ordinates the edition of publications in electronic and print form deemed to be in the interest of UMAC and the university museum's community. It is responsible for supervising the selection, editing and printing of the double blind refereed Conference Proceedings.

### **Aim for 2010-11**

To revive the activities of the Research Development Group.

In the last year this group has not undertaken any specific activity to inform the function and aims listed above. There have been some discussions by the Chair and the following plan is put forward to reactivate the group around two specific activities for 2011-2012.

#### **1. Compilation of extensive University Museum bibliography**

UMAC has a successful journal well established and about to publish its fourth issue. Whgile all of the contributions to this journal are based on university museums, there are other publications (refereed and non-refereed) that also focus on the particular circumstances of university museums.

It is proposed that this information be brought together in an extensive bibliography to be made available to researchers on the UMAC website. This can be done by searching known academic and library databases for appropriate articles. Assistance will also be sought from members on various relevant listervers to aid the compilation.

As much of the searching of databases is a time intensive project, a small seeding grant is requested from UMAC (2000AUD) to pay for the services of a student interested in university museums to undertake the search. I seek endorsement from the UMAC Board for this activity.

## **2. Compilation of University Museum research projects**

It would also be useful to have a compilation of all current (and completed) research programs on university museums available to members on the UMAC website. This can be done as a proforma to include information on funding agency, amount, brief description of project and completion date. Research for Masters and PhD projects should also be collated as part of the list.

This would best be done through internal communications among the working group and the UMAC-L listserve.

The current list of members for this working group are given below. These people will all be individually contacted by the Chair (at their last known email address) to both seek participation in this project and ascertain if they are willing to continue as active members of the working group. Given the period of inactivity of the group some of these former group members' interests may have changed and they may wish to exit the group. A call for new members can also be made at the UMAC 2011 AGM with the Board's endorsement.
