## UMAC's functions include:

- exchange of ideas among all those working in, or associated with, university museums, galleries and collections (including herbaria and botanical gardens)
- provision of a forum to identify partnership opportunities, share resources, knowledge and experience, and to enhance access to collections
- communication with its members throughout the year, including a yearly conference
- formulation of policies to assist curators, management and other stakeholders and, if requested, advice to university management, ICOM and other professional bodies on matters within its jurisdiction
- be a strong advocate of university museums and collections within governments and their agencies, institutes of learning, the broader museum sector, business, the professions and the general public
- encouragement of mentorship and career development, including staff exchanges
