UMAC was founded in 2001 to help preserve and provide access to this significant part of national and international heritage with its many unique and unusual collections

UMAC's functions include:

- **exchange of ideas** among all those working in, or associated with, academic museums, galleries and collections (including herbaria and botanical gardens)
- provision of a forum to identify partnership opportunities, share the resources in collections, knowledge and experience, and to enhance access to the collections
- **communication** with its members throughout the year, including one conference
- **formulation of policies** to assist curators, management and other stakeholders and, when requested, advice to university management, ICOM and other professional bodies on matters within its jurisdiction
- promotion of university museums and collections within governments and their agencies, institutes of learning, the broad museum sector, the professions, business and the population generally
- encouragement of mentorship and career development, including staff exchanges.
